Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program Information and Clinical Obligations

Program Schedule

Students are admitted to the Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program on a competitive basis, as clinical space is limited. Once selected and admitted into the Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program, students attend classes, labs, and clinicals for 5 consecutive semesters. Students must complete courses in sequence in the 5 semesters as assigned. Program class, lab, and clinical schedules range from 20 to 39 hours per week typically between the hours of 7:00 am to 7:00 pm Monday through Friday. However, there are evening and weekend clinical schedules available. Clinical education centers and course schedules will be assigned by program officials. Students may not request clinical education centers or schedules.

Program Immunization, Health, and CPR Requirements

After selection but prior to admission, students selected for any of the medical imaging programs are required to submit a physical exam prior to admission. This physical exam must be consistent with the requirements of the teaching hospitals and agencies the student is assigned during clinical assignments and the performance standards required to function as a student imaging technologist (Core Performance Standards). The exam will also include documentation of any communicable diseases along with immunity to Rubella, Measles, Mumps, Varicella, and Hepatitis B. Additionally, completion of an updated Tetanus vaccine, an annual TB screening, and a seasonal flu vaccine are required. Clinical education centers require the COVID-19 vaccination.

In addition to meeting all other requirements, a criminal background check and drug and alcohol screening are required for all health science students attending medical imaging courses and are required prior to admission to the program. Additionally, the criminal background check, and the drug and alcohol screening will be rechecked annually during your tenure in the program. Students entering a medical imaging program will also be required to show proof of health insurance and current CPR (American Heart Association-BLS) certification.

After selection but prior to admission students purchase and utilize CastleBranch to complete background checks and drug and alcohol screening as well as store and maintain immunizations, titers, CPR, and health insurance documentation. It is the student's responsibility to ensure all requirements are maintained and current. Failure to complete requirements prior to expiration may jeopardize the student's clinical education assignment or placement.

External Learning Experience Requirements

Students enrolling into San Jacinto College programs with external learning experiences (i.e., clinical, practicum, externship, cooperative, etc.) will be required to comply with the immunization requirements and policies of the clinical/external learning sites to engage in all clinical/external learning experiences. Vaccination requirements at clinical/external learning sites are implemented pursuant to the independent authority of such facilities and are not mandated by San Jacinto College. Failure to meet the immunization requirements mandated by clinical/external learning sites may limit a student's ability to complete the program and/or may delay the student's graduation date. San Jacinto College does not process exemptions, and students should address potential vaccination exemptions directly with the clinical/external learning site.

Program Professional Appearance Requirements

Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program students are required to present themselves in a professional manner on campus and at clinical education centers. Uniforms are required for on-campus and clinical education activities. Uniforms are purchased through the approved vendor prior to the start of the program.

Clinical Education Promptness and Attendance Requirements

Clinical attendance, promptness, and participation are required for a student to be successful in the Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program. Absences are considered unexcused except in the rarest of circumstances such as military service or court ordered subpoena to serve as a witness. Any other emergencies must be approved by the Program Director. Tardiness and leaving early from the clinical education center are not permitted. Continued tardiness and/or leaving

early may result in probation, suspension, or dismissal from the program. Students purchase and utilize Trajecsys Clinical reporting system for clinical attendance documentation and competency completion.

Clinical Education Sites

While in the Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program, program officials will assign students to Hospital and Clinical Affiliates for clinical education. The Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program expects all applicants for admission to possess and be able to demonstrate the skills, attributes, and qualities set forth below. Accepted students must continue to comply with the Core Performance Standards while enrolled in the Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program.

MOTOR SKILLS	Physical ability sufficient to move from room to room, maneuver in small places, and physical health stamina needed to carryout sonographic procedures. Operate the ultrasound machine for manipulation of technical factors and identification of anatomic structures. Position patients for various procedures.
MOBILITY & PHYSICAL ENDURANCE	Physical ability sufficient to move from room to room, maneuver in small places, and physical health stamina needed to carry out sonographic and other medical procedures.	Move about in ultrasound room, workspaces, and patient rooms; administer cardiopulmonary procedures if warranted. Lift, move, and transport patients (from bed to wheelchair/stretcher and from wheelchair; stretcher to ultrasound table) without causing pain or discomfort to patient or oneself. Stand or walk for extensive periods of time, including during sterile or operating room settings. Transport mobile equipment in a timely and cautious manner.
SENSORY	Sufficient use of the senses of vision, hearing, touch, and smell to observe, assess and evaluate effectively (both close at hand and at a distance) in the classroom, laboratory, and clinical setting	Hear monitor alarms and emergency signals. Hear and understand patients and other healthcare providers. Observe patient responses. Assess changes in patient color and skin texture. Perform palpation for positioning of patient.

Adapt to a progressive increase in classroom/clinical workload, clinical responsibilities, and patient assignments. Ability to organize tasks to utilize time in an effective manner.
